

XYLAZINE: What to Know

Xylazine or "tranq", a non-opioid veterinary sedative being mixed into the illicit New Jersey drug supply, is NOT safe or FDA approved for human use.



36%

One-third (36%) of all heroin/fentanyl contained xylazine in 2022¹

Risks of Xylazine Use

- Confusion
- Heavy sedation
- Dry mouth
- Drowsiness
- Reduced heart rate
- Difficulty breathing
- Coordination difficulties
- Coma



*Xylazine use has also been associated with severe, painful wounds that worsen quickly.

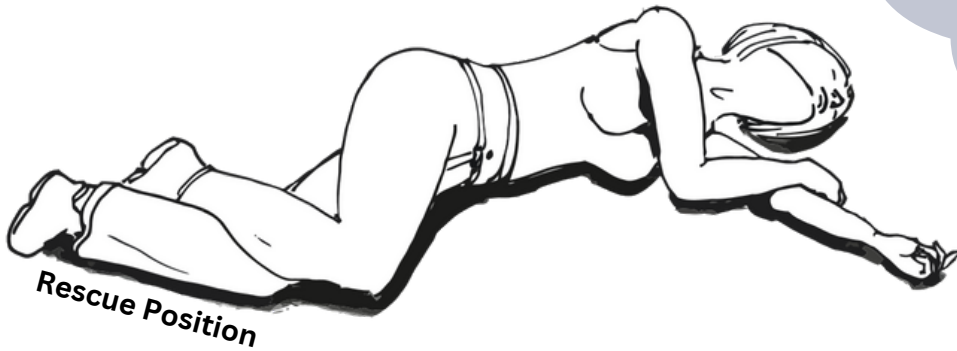
Xylazine Overdose: 3 Things to Know²

Naloxone

Knowing how to respond during a possible xylazine involved overdose is critical for saving a life!

Time

Rescue Breaths



Suspected Opioid/Xylazine Overdose³

- Check for responsiveness
- If the person does not respond or is unconscious:
 - Shout for nearby help
 - Activate emergency response system/call 9-1-1
 - Get naloxone and AED if available

Check if the Person is Breathing Normally

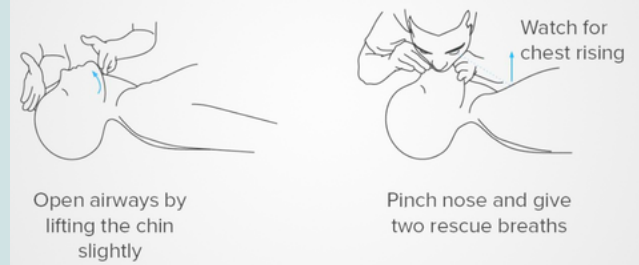
If **yes**, prevent deterioration: tap and shout, reposition (rescue position), consider naloxone, continue to observe until EMS arrives. Continue to check person is responsive and breathing.

Overdose Reversal

If person is **not** breathing normally, begin overdose reversal process:

- Give one dose of Naloxone.
- Start CPR:
 - Place the heel of your hand on center of person's chest and place other hand on top.
 - Start chest compressions (30 compressions).
 - Give two rescue breaths. Squeeze the person's nose and place your mouth over theirs and give two breaths. Use a mouth barrier or mask, if available.
- Use an AED, if available.
- Resume CPR until EMS arrives.

Rescue breaths

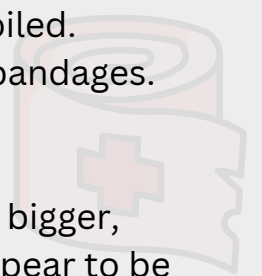


Administering Additional Naloxone

- If person is still **not** breathing after 2-3 minutes, administer another dose of naloxone.
- **REMEMBER:** Overdoses can look different when xylazine is involved. A person may be slower to wake up due to xylazine's sedative effects. Checking for breathing and rescue breaths are critical tools since naloxone only reverses effects of opioid overdose.

Wound Care

- If wounds develop from xylazine use, try to avoid injecting in or near the wound.
- Keep wounds clean, covered, and change bandages daily or when soiled.
- Wash wounds with soap/water or saline *thoroughly* after removing bandages.
- Apply a layer of Vaseline to clean wounds before rebandaging.
- Store wound care materials in a clean and dry location.
- Seek medical attention *promptly* if you develop a fever, wound gets bigger, drastically changes in color (i.e., yellow/green/black), or does not appear to be healing after several days.
