About the sculptor...

Seward was born on April 16, 1930, in New Jersey, the grandson of Robert Wood Johnson Sr. — one of the founders of Johnson & Johnson. By the age of six, he had lived in London, Paris, Bermuda and New Mexico. Seward and his family lived at Ghost Ranch in New Mexico, where they befriended American artists Georgia O'Keeffe and Alfred Stieglitz. In 1950, he enlisted in the U. S. Navy and served during the Korean War. When his four-year stint with the Navy ended, he set out on a 2,200 mile canoe trip from western Alberta to the upper edge of the Northwest Territories on the Arctic Ocean. An adventurous man...
