### **RESOLUTION #133-2014**

#### **GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT**

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

**WHEREAS**, the Annual Report of Audit for the year ending December 31, 2013 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

**WHEREAS**, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

**WHEREAS**, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations; and

**WHEREAS**, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations", as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

**WHEREAS**, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

**WHEREAS**, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

**WHEREAS**, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City Council of the City of South Amboy, hereby states that it has complied with N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Ken Feely, 31 Barkalow St., Explained that recently myself and my neighbor had our driveways redone and we filled out the right paperwork and even spoke to the engineering company who was supposed to come out to our house and he never showed they were supposed to be there the day we were laying down our driveway we also found out they also gave us the ok to go ahead and do it. The letters were sent we didn't know they were supposed to be there when we were having it pulled up nothing stated that in their letter but they said they will be there just let us know when you are going to have it paved so we called them and both my neighbor and myself called several times. Council President, Joe Connors asked who you called. Mr. Feely answered Feist Engineering and I would like to know why I would pay this money and got nothing for it. In the past I have had to pull permits and everything else for the work I have done on my house over the years and everything has been fine because we had our own township employees taking care of this but now we have an outside engineering firm who has been with this town and they are not doing their job and I would like to know why because they told us over the phone they will be there and nobody was there. City Engineer, Mark Rasimowicz stated I disagree to my understanding we were out there to look at it. Mr. Feely stated he was outside the whole day and no one came. Mark Rasimowicz stated I will follow up and find out what day it was inspected and get back to you. Mr. Feely replied you were supposed to be there the day of so you are telling me you did a drive by and you're telling me it was done that day or was it done another day. Mark Rasimowicz replied I don't know what day you are exactly talking about but I will follow up with my office and let you know what day we were out there.

Andrew Ceresco, 120 Roosevelt St., asked about Ordinance 10-2014 after Sandy permit fees and reconstruction fees have been waived I just want to clarify if there is anything we have to do. Business Administrator, Camille Tooker responded we have already done our Resolution till the end of the year anyone who has to apply for permits to do repairs that were caused by super storm Sandy you just have to let them know. Mr. Ceresco stated ok thank you for clarifying. Mr. Cresco also explained in applying to rebuild we had to obviously through zoning and we did a variance and in coming into get the information to pass along to my engineer and architect I was given the building code that we would have to follow which was grateful we received it and it was a photocopy but there was a lot of time and effort involved by our engineer to fish through and get a few pages that he needed and also a lot of back and forth between AJV Engineering and my engineer to get everything together that they would need and I would like to make a recommendation to the council the first is to formally codify the building code it's not codified. Council President, Joe Connors responded that it is in progress right now. Mr. Ceresco replied excellent thank you and the second would be to make it available on some kind of electric format whether it's on the internet website. Joe Connors replied it's all in progress right now. Mr. Ceresco replied thank you very much.

Michael Cataula, 1562 Burnett Ave. Union, NJ, stated I heard you talk about the closing of the parks I am a disabled veteran and I park in the handicap zone in the parks lately the fishing has been terrible during the day and the evening at sunset and a little after the fishing becomes very good. I have gotten to where I have to go back to my car get in and drive two and a half blocks away and then walk two and a half blocks back to the beach to get to my fishing poles I am handicap I have 40 percent blockage in both legs and one in my artery going to my heart is there some way I can get a permit so I can keep my truck or my car there in the parking area where it is only half a block to the beach I willing to work with you if you have a problem with the children maybe put a pole up with a camera on it that says 24 hour surveillance it doesn't even have to be hooked up just the threat of it would keep the kids from acting up in the parking lot and besides that winter is coming and it is getting cold and they are back in school again I am asking if I can stay in a handicapped zone I am not bothering anyone just fishing on the beach. Council President, Joe Connors replied I have had this discussion with our business administrator Camille Tooker and the first question I asked her was if the fisherman's parking lot was open because it's that time of year again we will be putting in a camera so we can open it up again I am just not sure how fast that will happen. Business Administer, Camille Tooker asked Mr. Cataula if after the meeting she could meet with him so she could be clear on exactly where he is parking. Mr. Cataula responded that he parks in the fisherman's parking lot off of Spinnaker Dr. and there are no parking signs all up Spinnaker drive and when you turn the corner the rest of the street says Fire Dept. no parking at anytime so it took that whole street up and then they took away the parking lot it's for residents and guest only. Joe Connors replied that is not true that parking is open to anyone in South Amboy so they can have access to the beach because that beach belongs to the residents. Mr. Cataula asked maybe in that parking lot we can make two of the spaces handicap which is just a walk across the street and you're back on the beach again. Camille Tooker asked Mr. Cataula if she can take his phone number and get back to him on this and I will certainly look into this for you. Mr. Cataula agreed he also stated there was an accident on the beach two months ago and I was on the emergency squad for 18 years in my town we had keys to most of the parks were if someone got injured in the park the ambulance could drive in you have a yellow

pole with a key on and its locked and when the person got hurt on the beach the ambulance drove down to Spinnaker drive and just stopped they had to walk through the houses down the hill down the beach when they could have just drove into the parking lot unlocked that key turned the truck around and backed up maybe 50 feet were its still hard surface and they could have got to that injured person which was only 50 yards away what happen was they had to pick that person up carry them up over the dunes walk two and a half blocks around back to where the ambulance was and yet in my town in my town we had keys to all the facilities so we actually go there if there was a chain up or fence was locked we could unlock it and get to the injured person. Camille Tooker responded that that has already been taken care of we had several areas were we had locks and it did come to our attention that first aide did not have a key so that has been taken care of.

Barbara Pasternack, 29 Barkalow St. Stated the YMCA has the child care center on the second floor and I notice that there are a lot of children there especially during the summer when they have the camps has there ever been a fire drill. Council President, Joe Connors answered he is not a member of the YMCA. Business Administrator, Camille Tooker answered the YMCA is licensed through the state that is where they get there childcare license from we have nothing to do with that so that facility is approved for childcare some are so are not that has nothing to do with the city all of that comes through the state of NJ and I can tell you there have been fire drills. Ms. Pasternack asked who owns the YMCA. Camille Tooker stated that SARA owns the YMCA. Ms. Pasternack asked how does that effect the tax payers are we paying anything into the YMCA that is going into the Redevelopment agency. Camille Tooker stated no the YMCA pays to the redevelopment agency they have a lease. Ms. Pasternack asked when the Center is going to open. Camille Tooker stated it will open shortly they are in there final permit approval process so when that is done they will get their CO and they will be transporting patients in.

Laurie Papernik, 42 South Shore Dr. asked if there has been an update on the beach replenishment WRRDA Program since the meeting with Congressman Pallone. Business administrator, Camille Tooker responded she spoke with Congressman Pallone's office I also spoke with Mark Rasimowicz but we just have to clear something up we are not talking about the beach replenishment in order to get a grant for beach replenishment you have to have a beach that has been maintained and you have a program that you do every year up until this point we have never had a set program and yes we have followed up on your meeting. Ms. Papernik asked this is a different grant we don't need the beach replenishment. Camille Tooker responded no not yet because the first thing we have to do is have our beach all done and then we have to institute a maintenance program so we can prove that we have maintained the beach, we have put additional sand down so another storm came and look what we lost at that point it becomes replenishment but we have to prove that we have had a program all along. What you are talking about and what we have spoken to Congressman Pallone's office is for the Army Core to come in and evaluate our shore front to see if they would bring in a project to protect the waterfront they are two different things but we are on the same page. A formal request to the Army Core has come from the city which is what Congressman Pallone's office had recommended. Ms Papernik asked if Pallone's office sent this after our meeting. Camille Tooker stated that we have taken the step to request the core to take a look at South Amboy and then Pallone's office will also support that request

but at the same time we can take the incentive as we are finishing the waterfront area to get a program in place for that beach so we that we can say that we do this and we have this much beach but now a storm came and we only have this much beach so then we can talk about replenishment but we have to bring it a little further down the road.

Ms. Anderson, 4 South Shore Dr, asked if during activities at the middle High school we can limit parking on O'Leary Blvd. to only the side that has a sidewalk because people are riding their bike on the other side walking on the other side and there are cars not even parked close enough to the side they are kind of in the middle of the street so it is causing cars to have to drive on the other side. Council President, Joe Connors replied we will look into that we can have the police Department step up patrol on the weekends.

Ruth, 54 South Shore Dr., I wanted to follow up on the last meeting I asked about the cost of losses in South Amboy due to Hurricane Sandy and I was told that I would get this information. Business Administrator, Camille Tooker replied yes you did ask me and I will get it to you are you asking for the total of everything. Ruth replied yes I would like to know what is the loss incurred due to Sandy we already know what are community got I would just like to know a ball park figure. Camille Tooker asked are you talking about city wide everything. Ruth replied I would prefer the area where the water is coming in from the bay where there is water damage.
